Highly regarded for their English and French fusion dishes with award winning chefs, Claude Paillet, Alan Bell and Howard Gale, the menu is extensive with starters and salads, main dishes, desserts and daily specials, as well as a pub menu. All the food is freshly prepared, using organic produce from local suppliers where possible.
